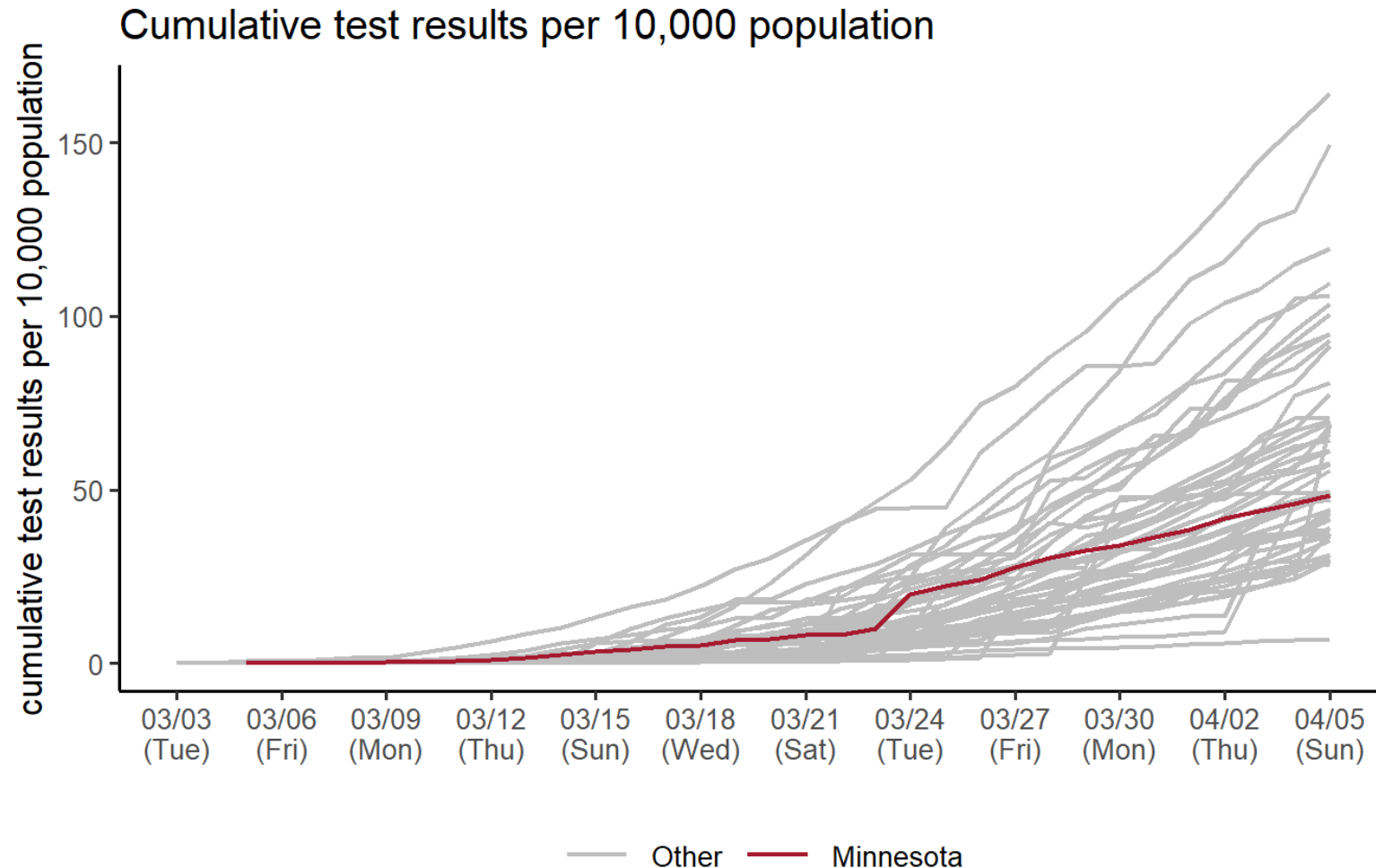
Suggested Commercial Laboratory Specimen Testing Priorities

Symptomatic:

- individuals (residents or staff) in congregate living settings (long term care facilities, prisons/jails, homeless shelters, etc.)
- dialysis patients
- hospitalized patients
- health care workers taking care of immunosuppressed patients
- health care workers and their ill household contacts
- patients 65 years of age and older
- patients with underlying medical conditions
- first responders
- child care providers

Minnesota has conducted 48.4 total tests per 10,000 residents as of April 5, ranking 32nd.



Samples tested daily in MN

Statewide testing capacity

Daily survey of labs	Response
Daily current capacity	10,258
Percent of current daily capacity in use	13.7%

Mayo has capacity to run 5,000 tests per day
